# MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



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**This past year has been one of growth, connection, and meaningful progress for the Campbell River Hospice Society.**

Throughout the year, our focus has remained firmly on individuals and families in our community who are facing end-of-life, traumatic grief following the death of a loved one – whether an adult or a child – as well as those supporting loved ones through caregiving. Our team has continued to provide compassionate, professional, and trauma-informed support, while finding new ways to reach people where they are and respond to the changing needs of our community.

One of the most exciting developments has been the continued growth of the Hospice Thrift Store. The expansion of our store operation represents much more than increased retail space. It strengthens an important source of sustainable revenue that helps us protect and expand hospice programs and services. At a time when the majority of our funding must be generated within our community, building reliable sources of earned revenue is essential to our long-term stability.

This year has also reinforced what makes the Campbell River Hospice Society so special: people coming together with a shared commitment to caring for one another. Our staff, Board of Directors, volunteers, donors, community partners, and supporters each play an important role in making our work possible. Their dedication allows us to continue serving our community with compassion, professionalism, and integrity.

However, we also recognize the growing financial challenges facing our organization. For another year, only 3.5% of our funding comes from government sources, outside of our annual gaming grant. At the same time, the availability of both public and government grants has become increasingly limited, while the rising cost of living has made fundraising more challenging for many of the generous community members and businesses who have supported us in the past.

As we look ahead, funding sustainability will once again be a major focus for the coming year. We will be placing greater emphasis on major gifts, planned giving, monthly donations, and one-time contributions, while continuing to grow the revenue generated through the Hospice Thrift Store and our fundraising initiatives.

This work is critical because it allows us to continue offering our one-of-a-kind specialized clinical programs and services at no cost to the people of our community. We believe that access to compassionate end-of-life care, grief support, and meaningful resources should not depend on someone's ability to pay. Keeping these services free is at the heart of our mission, and it is only possible because our community continues to stand behind us.

I am incredibly proud of what our organization has accomplished this year and of the team that continues to move our mission forward. We know there is more work to do as awareness of hospice and grief support grows and the needs within our community continue to evolve.

To everyone who has donated, volunteered, shopped at the Hospice Thrift Store, attended our events, referred someone to our services, or simply shared our message – thank you. Your support has a direct and lasting impact on the lives of people in our community.

Together, we are ensuring that compassionate care, grief support, and connection remain available to everyone who needs them – at no cost, when they need it most.

## OUR END-OF -LIFE PROGRAM

Led by Leslie Haynes-Hodgins, M.S.W., R.S.W., and our clinical team provided 4,822 hours of compassionate grief and palliative care counselling this past year, supporting individuals and families throughout our community.

Our trained volunteers are an important part of this work, offering compassionate companionship and practical support under the guidance and clinical oversight of our professional team. Together, our clinical staff and volunteers ensure that individuals and families receive thoughtful, consistent, and person-centred care throughout their hospice journey.

Hospice support is provided wherever it is needed. Our team and trained volunteers meet with individuals in their own homes and long-term care facilities, bringing compassionate support directly to people during some of the most difficult times in their lives.

Our clinical team carefully monitors each client's wellness journey throughout their time with Hospice, helping ensure that we maintain the highest standards of care and support.

As the need for grief and palliative support continues to grow, we remain committed to walking alongside individuals and families with compassion, dignity, and clinical excellence – helping them navigate loss, find resilience, and move toward healing.

## OUR CAREGIVERS PROGRAM

Our Caregiver Support Group is a welcoming, drop-in program for anyone caring for a loved one who is seriously ill, aging, or approaching end of life. The group is facilitated by retired nurses and experienced long-term caregivers who understand the realities of caregiving. They provide a safe and supportive space to connect with others, share experiences, ask questions, and learn practical strategies for navigating the caregiving journey.

Participants can receive support with understanding what to expect, navigating services and resources, communicating with healthcare providers, managing changing family roles, and coping with the emotional and physical demands of caregiving.

Caregivers are welcome to drop in when they need connection, guidance, or simply a place to be with others who understand.

## OUR GRIEF PROGRAM

Our grief support program is designed to help individuals and their families navigate the many ways grief can affect our lives. Through clinical one-to-one counselling, family counselling, grief groups, caregiver support, and specialized programs, participants have opportunities to better understand their grief, develop coping strategies, and connect with others who have experienced loss.

Our approach recognizes that grief is experienced differently by everyone. Alongside clinical counselling and group support, we offer a range of holistic and therapeutic activities that can help people relax, reconnect with themselves, and explore different ways of coping. These may include Reiki, yoga for grief, sound therapy, mindfulness, meditation, creative expression, and other wellness-based activities.

Grief can affect the whole family, and our program provides opportunities for family members to learn how to communicate about loss, understand different grief responses, and support one another. For some, participating in a grief group provides connection and the reassurance of knowing they are not alone in their experience.

There is no single path through grief and no set timeline for healing. Our program offers a variety of supports and approaches so individuals and families can find what works best for them as they move through their own experience of loss.

Through our grief program, Hospice helps people build understanding, resilience, connection, and the tools to move forward while continuing to honour the people and relationships they have lost.



## OUR TRAUMATIC CHILD & YOUTH PROGRAM

Again this year, the Child & Youth Traumatic Grief Program continued to provide specialized, compassionate support for children and youth experiencing the death of someone significant in their lives. Through art, play, creative expression, therapeutic activities, and conversation, young people are given safe, age-appropriate ways to understand their loss, express their emotions, and develop healthy coping skills.

A highlight this year was our three-day Children's Grief Summer Day Camp, which brought together grief support, connection, learning, and fun. Through arts and crafts, memory-making, outdoor activities, mindfulness, group conversations, and activities focused on emotions and coping, children connected with others who had also experienced loss and discovered they were not alone.

The program also supports the wider family, helping parents and caregivers navigate their own grief while supporting their children. In many cases, several family members receive support through Hospice, creating opportunities to develop a shared understanding of grief and learn healthier ways to cope together.

Thanks to the Hospice Visionary Circle members, these services are provided at no cost, ensuring children, youth, and their families can access specialized support regardless of their financial circumstances.

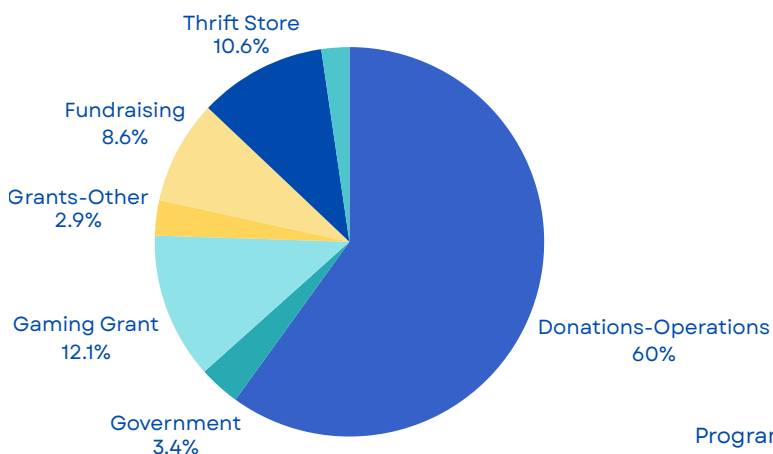

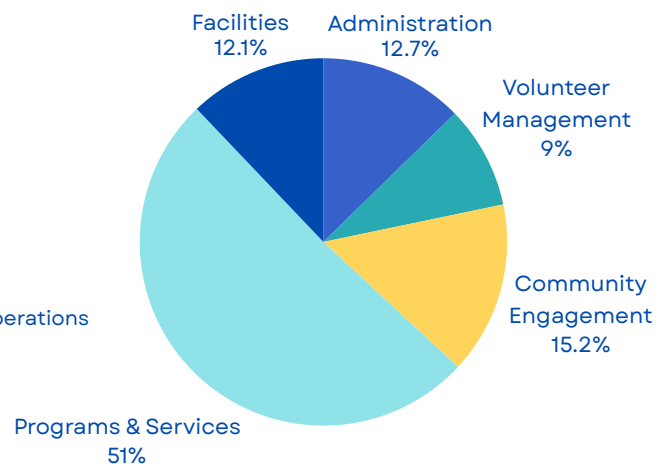

Providing these services at no cost to our community is not easy. Like many non-profits, we are facing a challenging financial environment. Fundraising revenue is becoming harder to secure, grant opportunities are declining, and the cost of delivering our programs and services continues to rise.

With only approximately 3.5% of our funding coming from government, we cannot rely on government funding to sustain the work we do. The vast majority of the funds needed to provide hospice and grief care must be generated by our Society.

Despite these challenges, we continue to adapt. We are finding innovative ways to generate sustainable revenue through new fundraising initiatives, community partnerships, education opportunities, and the continued growth and success of our Hospice Thrift Store.

Every event, donation, partnership, grant, and Thrift Store purchase helps us continue providing compassionate end-of-life and grief support at no cost to the people who need us.
